INTRODUCTION

This is the Orientation Packet containing materials to be reviewed for application, reapplication, or remaining on indigent appointment lists included in the Uniform Indigent Appointment Regulations of July 1, 2019. An attorney seeking to be placed on or to remain on a list should review both the materials listed under the All Lists section as well as those in the sections relating to all lists for which inclusion is sought. For ease of access, all items possible have been hyperlinked to their locations on the Internet.

Note that materials are designated as either "Read" or "Be Familiar With." "Read" means that an attorney seeking to be on a list should actually read the materials listed in their entirety. In order not to burden busy attorneys, there are few items that require reading, and those that are designated as such are generally short and/or may have been read at some point in the attorney's training or career. "Be familiar with," on the other hand, means to be aware of the item as a resource, to make a cursory examination of it, and to know what is in it for when it is needed.
